

Prudhoe Town Survey : The Results Are In!



233 people completed the survey carried out by Prudhoe Community Partnership in May and June 2018. This represents 1 person in 50 living in Prudhoe. The survey was compiled and analysed independently by Community Action Northumberland.

Prudhoe rated Good to Great

83% of people responding rated Prudhoe *** to ***** - between good and great as a place to live. A small minority, about 17%, really didn't like living in Prudhoe.

How the Partnership responded:

You said: Improving youth services was a high priority

We did: Set up a new voluntary youth project to increase provision for young people. This is a long term project that will take several years to mature

You said: More arts activities would be welcome and maybe an arts centre

We did: set up a new sub group to organise cultural activities and look at whether an arts centre is feasible in future

You said: services for older people were good but some people said more could be done for people with dementia.

We did: Plan to work with others to make Prudhoe a dementia friendly town, starting in 2019

You said: access to shops for people in wheelchairs and people with buggies could be improved.

We did: launch Purple Tuesday in Prudhoe to make shop keepers more aware of the needs of people with disabilities.

'Just to Say' – see below - won the prize for best dressed shop and the event was featured on Tyne Tees news.



You said: Prudhoe needs more social housing at affordable rents

We did: Following on from building new shops and flats on Front St, are working on another social housing scheme in the town.

You said: The town centre needs livening up and the shop fronts could be more attractive

We did: Set up a joint working party with Prudhoe Town Council to see what might be achieved.

You said: Public transport around the town could be improved.

We will: Look into setting up a volunteer driving scheme as soon as possible, probably in 2020

You said: You wanted to volunteer. One third of people responding offered to help in the community showing that Prudhoe is a friendly town.

We will: Try to set up a volunteer exchange, as soon as we can, hopefully by 2020.

You said: Pot holes must be filled after the winter snow and parking should be improved.

We did: take these issues up with Northumberland County Council
